DEFINITION:

Under the limited supervision of a staff or faculty employee, a student usually performs all or part of the following duties:

- (a) Assists in supervising and delegating responsibility to attendants as needed.
- (b) Supervises and directs activity in attended areas.
- (c) Provides security in attended areas.
- (d) Checks identification of persons entering attended areas.

BASIC QUALIFICATIONS:

- (a) Broad technical knowledge and thorough understanding of problems relating to the areas to be served.
- (b) Two (2) academic years (four semesters) of experience as an attendant or two (2) years of comparable experience outside

UIC. FOR LIFEGUARD:

Experience waived, but the student must possess current senior lifesaving and water safety instructor certificates.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR STARTING AT STEP B:

Same as basic plus an additional year of experience. For lifeguards, a year of experience is required.
