## **DEFINITION:**

Under the limited supervision of a staff or faculty employee, a student usually performs the following duties:

- (a) Assists in training and supervising Audio-Visual Technician II.
- (b) Conducts repairs, checks, adjustments, and cleaning of various audio-visual equipment.
- (c) Monitors video signals during television productions, adjusting gain controls for optimum video signal as needed.
- (d) Collaborates in designing audio and visual installations to achieve optimal acoustic effects, screen placement, and other desired outcomes.

## **BASIC QUALIFICATIONS:**

One (1) academic year (two semesters) as an Audio-Visual Technician II <u>and</u> at least six (6) months experience in the repair of electronic and mechanical audio-visual equipment <u>or</u> one (1) year comparable experience outside UIC.

## QUALIFICATIONS FOR STARTING AT STEP B:

Same as above, plus an additional year of comparable experience.
